
## Global Competence Professional Development Training

- Sensitivity: Cultivating an attitude of inclusion, openness to learning, cultural humility, and appreciation for diversity and the strengths each person brings to relationships and work engagements
- Ethical Practice: Engaging in ethical, values-driven practices and acting with integrity and global competence in our everyday work and lives
